YOU ARE NOT JUST A NUMBER! You are the bakers, the crafters, the flag protectors, the caregivers, the volunteers, you are a senior member or you are a junior member, but most importantly you are a Member of the Largest Women's Patriotic Organization – the American Legion Auxiliary, who supports our veterans, active military, their families, our youth, and our communities.

In 2013-2014, in the spirit of Service Not Self, we the members of the American Legion Auxiliary Department of Wisconsin volunteered more than 400,000 hours, donated more than \$897,000 and served more than 43,000 veterans, active military and their families. These numbers are from only 264 units in Wisconsin. We know that the other 164 units volunteered and donated but they did not report.

Why is reporting so important? The numbers collected from our annual reports and combined with the other 51 Auxiliary Departments are sent to The American

Legion. The combined American Legion Family statistics are reported to Congress by The American Legion to demonstrate what we do for our veterans, active military, their families, and our communities. What you do does make a difference!

The Concert Tours have been very successful in promoting the programs of the American Legion Auxiliary, developing leaders, instilling a culture of goodwill, and having fun with membership. If we promote our programs and involve our communities we will become so well known that people will want to become members of

our organization.

As we honor our veterans on November 11, 2014 and thank them for their service, keep in mind that if our membership continues to drop 5% or more each year, by 2030 the American Legion Auxiliary may no longer exist. Who will be the voice for our veterans in our communities? Who will promote peace and goodwill on earth? And who will be there to safeguard the principles of justice, freedom and democracy?

Unit members are the foundation; without them our organization will crumble. As I travel

Wisconsin and visit unit, county, and district meetings and events, I am able to meet and talk with our members. I may not remember your name, but know that you have touched my life and made a difference. Your membership in the American Legion Auxiliary makes a difference in the lives of our veterans, our military, and their families.

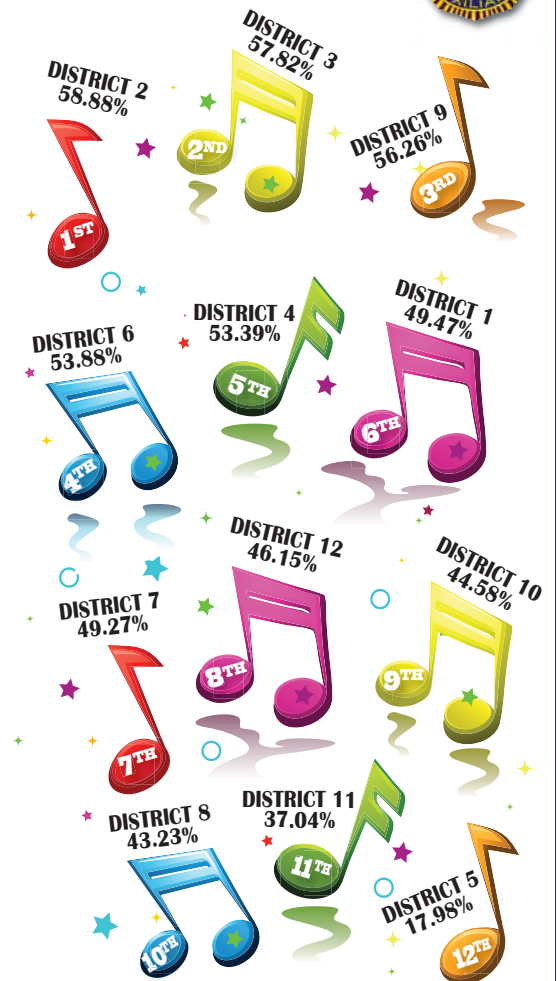

With Veterans Day right around the corner, don't forget to thank a veteran. Since I joined the Auxiliary in honor of my dad, I would like to say, "Thanks, James R. Bennett, for your service" (and Happy 85th Birthday later this month!).

Why do YOU belong to the American Legion Auxiliary? Is it to honor a special loved one who served years ago? Or to show support for a family member now serving in the military? Or simply because Grandma signed you up and you don't want to disappoint her by letting your membership lapse?

As an organization, we spend so much time and energy on retaining and recruiting members that we lose focus of our mission: *to support The American Legion and to honor the sacrifice of those who serve by enhancing the lives of our veterans, military, and their families.* I think if we shift our energy to working our Auxiliary programs, women will seek us out and ask how they, too, can become involved. But they will only get involved if they know what we do!

If your unit sponsors a Veterans Day program at the local school, promote it in the newspaper. If you collect tattered flags to dispose of them properly, advertise it in the newspaper. If you adopt a local family to provide food and gifts for the holidays, request donations through the newspaper. If you want to send care packages to a military unit but don't know where to send them, put an article in the newspaper asking your neighbors to provide contact information for someone they know who is deployed.

Donate leftover poppies to the local grade school and hold a poppy decorating contest – then promote the winning entries in the newspaper explaining the significance of the poppy. In every newspaper article, include contact information

for the Unit President so people can follow-up if they want to get involved.

What about older members who aren't as active as they used to be? Maybe they could bake items for the Unit's Bake Sale, or make potato salad for the Independence Day Community Celebration, or knit/sew lap blankets, or make tray favors for our veterans in the VA Hospitals and Veterans Homes across the state. Put an ad in the local paper and ask for donations of yarn and fabric or money to defray the cost of making and mailing items to the hospitals.

Do you have young, working moms who don't have time to attend meetings or events? They may be willing to be a pen pal or telephone friend for a homebound veteran in the area. They could send cards of encouragement or make brief phone calls just to say "hi" and see how the veteran is doing at any time that is convenient. Or maybe they would be willing to involve their kids and place flags on veterans' gravesites for Memorial Day or rake leaves for veterans who aren't able to take care of their yards like they once did.

When people feel good about a cause, they often join the organization so they can get involved. Hmm...does it sound like membership recruitment could be a great side effect of working our Auxiliary programs?!? If your unit has successfully gained members through a special project, please let me know so I can highlight it in a future Wisconsin article.

But don't forget: even if you "just pay your dues," it helps our veterans. The more members who belong to the American Legion Auxiliary, the louder our voice can be to influence political leaders to pass legislation on behalf of our veterans, the military and their families. So please...pay your dues today if you haven't already done so. And for those who have, THANK YOU. Now, let's get back to working our programs!

VETERANS AFFAIRS AND REHABILITATION

I am required to include the number of units participating in caregiver support with the Elizabeth Dole Foundation in my narrative year-end report. This foundation has identified a need to help caregivers of severely injured veterans. Thanks to advances in battlefield medicine, thousands of troops are now surviving. However, many have devastating wounds, both visible and invisible, and require care long after they leave the military health care system. Care may be labor-intensive or extremely burdensome depending on the number and severity of wounds, injuries, or illnesses. The caregivers are spouses, parents, children and relatives of the wounded veterans who provide care continuously, day and night, for they are sometimes the only available, knowledgeable, or trusted person to provide such care. We

have an obligation to support the few who endured so much for us all. Participants in the Caregiver Community Program ensure America's military and veteran caregivers do not go about caring for our wounded warriors alone. The program does not take the place of the caregiver – the activities are intended to support the caregiver during their time away from their work, giving them a reprieve.

I am also required to report the number of quilts made and donated to "Quilts of Valor." A Quilt of Valor is a generous lap-sized quilt (minimum of 55 x 65) made of quality fabrics and beautifully quilted. After it has been bound, washed, and labeled it is ready to be awarded. They may be given to military hospitals where Chaplains award them to service members, awarded to entire service units returning from deployments, through VA's or individually. The CamoQuilt project is considered a

Quilt of Valor. By going to the Quilts of Valor website, patterns and materials may be ordered. All hours will be considered as "Service to Veterans" hours.

My third requirement for reporting will be how many members earned the new Service to Veterans pin. Be sure that you keep a good record of all your volunteer hours for veterans outside the VA hospital setting.

Review the Plan of Action on the Wisconsin American Legion Auxiliary website to familiarize yourself with all of the programs concerning Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation. Are you starting to plan for the upcoming holiday season? Don't forget our hospitalized veterans with gift shops, holiday parties and patient goodies. If you have questions about any of our programs, please call me. May you and our veterans have a very blessed Christmas and a healthy New Year. Continue to 'Raise Your Voice in Song for Our Veterans.'

2015 DUES NOTICE!
